




The Best Way to Clean Large Windows









Place the scrubber on a pole and wet the upper part of the window horizontally along the top. Then scrub using up and down strokes. Place the squeegee in the upper right hand corner, against the top moulding. (Opposite corner if left handed)

Tilt the right edge of the squeegee down slightly and start your downward stroke.









Maintaining the squeegee in the tilted position, pull the squeegee down to shoulder height.

At the bottom of each stroke, tap the squeegee against the remaining wet portion of the glass.

Tilt the squeegee toward the remaining wet portion. This prevents dripping on the cleaned area.










Working along the entire window top, pull the squeegee down in a slightly diagonal direction.

On the last down stroke, place the squeegee against the lefthand moulding. Tilt the handle slightly toward the moulding and pull down. Hold the squeegee loosely and position the tool against the left vertical moulding, overlapping in to the dry portion of the window.







Tilt the squeegee down slightly and pull across the width of the window.

Tilt handle down slightly and squeegee across the window with the end of the squeegee rubber touching the moulding.

As the squeegee nears the moulding, turn blade, so the right edge touches the vertical moulding and complete the stroke against the bottom of the window.
